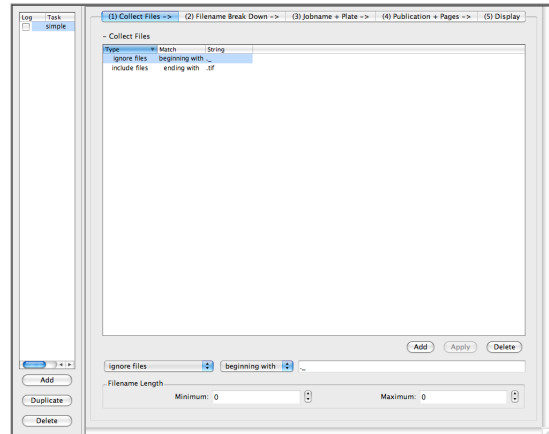


Job Genie

HowTo – Create a Task

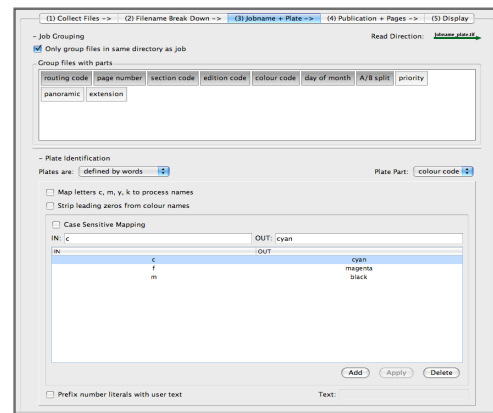
1. Select Job Genie from the Workbench Data Types list.
2. In the Job Genie, click the Add button to generate a new task.
3. Highlight the name, wait for edit mode and change the name as desired. Press Enter when done.
4. Select an appropriate action for the task.
5. Select an appropriate definition for the task.
6. Enter the characters for matching according to the action and definition configured.
7. Click Add (right side of screen) to add the item to the list.



If you do not enter anything in the collect files tab, all files in the path will be collected and passed on for sorting. This is less efficient and can take a long time if there are a lot of unrelated files in the path. It is better to try and specify to collect only files matching the jobs you want and ignore all others.

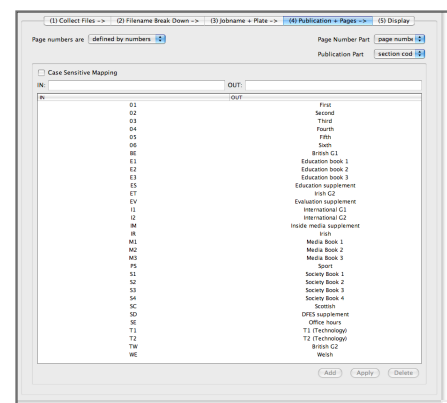
HowTo – Map a Plate

1. Select Job Genie from the Workbench Data Types list.
2. Select the appropriate item from the Job Genie list.
3. Click on the (3) Jobname + Plate tab.
4. Enter the colour name you want to map, for e.g., 100.
5. Enter the new colour name for e.g., 100 CVC.
6. Click Add.
7. Repeat as needed for all of the colour names that you wish to map.



HowTo – Map a Publication Name

1. Enter the text of the publication name from the files in the “In” text box. For e.g., *smh_monday_00.tif* has a publication name of *smh*.
2. Enter the alternative text. For e.g., *Sydney Morning Herald* in the “Out” text field.
3. Click the Add button at the bottom.
4. Repeat to add more as desired.
5. To make changes, select the text entry to load it into the “In” and “Out” fields.
6. Click Apply at the bottom to make any changes to the list and Save.



HowTo – Display the Jobname in the RIPMonitor

1. Select the part displayed in the list that was created as the Jobname. This may consist of one or more parts. For e.g., you may want to select a jobname and an edition name.
2. Click the Job Directory to display the directory name that the files are found in.
3. To display parents of directories, change d1 to d2. The higher the number, the higher up the directory structure you will display.
4. Each time you select a part of Job Directory, it enters or removes the item from the Jobname String field.
5. The items are added at the current cursor position. You can add spaces, any other characters or text as desired at any point of the field.

Use the directory in the Jobname String field when Only Group Files in Same Directory as Job is enabled. This is because the filenames usually have no real meaning, but are grouped into one directory where the name of the directory is the jobname.
